The Organizing Committee of the 106th International Conference of the International Association of Universities of the Third Age (AIUTA) is pleased to invite you to present a paper during this event which will take place from May 28th to 30th, 2020 at the University of Sherbrooke (Canada).

Anxious to enhance lifelong learning, we want to explore the potential of digital technology in our training courses which are aimed at seniors aged 50 and over.

In this spirit, the theme of the international conference is as follows:

IN THE DIGITAL AGE: NETWORK, INNOVATE, LEARN

It will be divided in three parts:

1- INNOVATION

- New approaches, educational formulas and possible applications with customers aged
 50 and over;
- New experiments or applied research on pedagogy, training programs for the elderly and lifelong education.

2- TECHNOLOGIES

- Sensible use of technologies in the service of training programs in AWUs or with seniors;
- Use of digital technology and technologies that promote better learning;



 Use of digital and technologies that allow the development of efficient management tools.

3- **NETWORKING**

• Use of digital and technologies that promote the creation of links and communication between people or organizations.

DATES TO PENCIL

The event will take place on May 29, 2020, from 9:30 a.m. to 16:30

TYPE OF COMMUNICATION and FORMAT OF THE MEETING

- It is a 20-minute oral presentation (15 minutes if the presentation is not in French or English);
- It must be supported by an audio-visual presentation (PowerPoint);
- There will be between 3 and 5 communications per component;
- The presentations of a section will be followed by a question period common to the presenters of a total duration of approximately 10 minutes.

LANGUAGE OF COMMUNICATION

- Communications made in French or English will be simultaneously translated into the other language;
- A presenter who delivers a communication in a language other than French or English must, himself, provide simultaneous oral translation in French or English;
- Visual presentations must be made in French or English.

SUBMISSION OF YOUR PRESENTATION

• Your project must be submitted by email to the following address uta.evenement@usherbrooke.ca





- It must contain a title;
- It must present clearly formulated objectives;
- It must contain a maximum of 200 words;
- The quality of this text must be monitored since it will be reproduced in the program;
- You must specify:
- o The language you will use during the presentation;
- o The audio-visual equipment required;
- o The name and title of the presenter.

DEADLINE

• Your communication project must be submitted no later than February 14, 2020.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

- The organizing committee will favour presentations that will directly concern the general theme and one of its components;
- The mission of our organization, whose training activities are aimed at seniors aged 50 and over, will be taken into account;

- The committee's decision will be final.
