#### Supporting education for older people in Shanghai, China

# Lifelong learning for development

Shanghai is the largest economic centre in the People's Republic of China. Lifelong learning is part of the city's DNA, and a driver for sustainable development.

A holistic lifelong learning approach is implemented across Shanghai, with a particular focus on older people, health education, education for sustainable development (ESD), and technical and vocational education and training (TVET). 21 local government agencies work together to coordinate learning in the city.

# Lifelong learning for an ageing population

With an average life expectancy of 83.64 years and a population over one fifth of which is over 60 years of age, Shanghai places a strong emphasis on learning opportunities for older people.

It boasts four municipal universities for the third age (U3A) and 44 affiliated schools, 18 district U3A universities, 221 subdistrict and town-level community schools for the elderly, and 5,589 neighbourhood and village learning stations for older people.

Shanghai's TV channel, 'Golden School', broadcasts courses for people over the age of 50. These cover six thematic areas and are watched by over one million citizens daily.

## Introduction to the "cloud" learning resources

- Lifelong Learning Cloud for Shanghai Citizens covers various topics, such as health and safety, cooking, entertainment, information technology, art, counselling, local history, and current affairs.
- Shanghai's TV channel Golden School broadcasts courses for people over the age of 50, which are watched by over 1 million citizens each day.
- CAUA Distance Education Network has a total of 629 courses and 4757 class hours.
- Shanghai Elderly Learning Network specially sets up for the elderly, and the website contains a Distance University for the Elderly.
